It has been a very productive week in Foundation Stage as we have been so busy learning lots of new things. FS2 have continued working on the text Oliver's vegetables. We have been writing a list of things Oliver found in his Grandpa's allotment. We have looked at the beans we planted last week for our experiment and we have been amazed at how quickly our cress has grown. You should try this at home! We have been finding out all about 3d shapes and looking for them in the environment. FS1 children have been writing their

names and numbers. They have also planted cress


and they will be watching it grew. We have taken advantage of the lovely weather we have had this week and have been playing lots of new games with the parachute outdoors. A reminder to all FS2 children, you have another week to complete at least 2 activities in your homework book. Remember to continue with your reading and try to read at least 3 times each week. Phase 1

We have had lots of exciting things happening in our Phase this week. Well done to Miss Ravenscroft's class for a fantastic class sharing assembly on Friday which was enjoyed by everyone! The children showed off their learning from their Kings and Queens topic and their Science and RE lessons. During the week, we have been learning about reptiles! In our writing, Years 1 have been writing about dragons and Year 2 have been writing a diary extract! In Maths, Year 1 have been finding 1 more and 1 less and year 2 have been adding 2 digit numbers.





In RE we have been learning about Islam. The children learned that Muslims believe in Allah and the Prophet Muhammad preached that people should be kind to one another. In indoor PE, the children have been exploring and describing different movements. In outdoor PE, the children are beginning to understand attacking and defending skills. Year 4 were an excellent example on Tuesday whilst visiting Winifred Holtby for their swimming assessment. We have some fantastic swimmers in our year and they were all extremely well behaved. Well done Year 4! The swimming lessons will commence in June so more information will be given about that closer to the summer term. Phase 2 had an incredible day yesterday visiting Hull City Centre and meeting Blade! We met with a Siemens



engineer and learned all about how the blade was built and what an impact it has had in our community. We also visited Hull Maritime museum and Ferens Art Gallery where the pupils asked excellent questions and learned all about their city of culture! It was brilliant to see our pupils so excited and exploring parts of old town they haven't seen before - why not let them take you on a tour themselves!

It's been another busy week in Phase 3! Thank you to all who attended our Aboriginal afternoon, we hope that you enjoyed yourselves. It was great to see so many of you attend and we were really impressed with the quality of art that you produced working alongside your children.
